# Pool and Playground Updates

- Working on different fee rate for playground
  - o Half day (resident rate): from \$175 to \$200 (\$5 per day)
  - o Full day (resident rate): increase from \$350 to \$400 (\$8.75 per day)
  - Non-resident rate increased from \$400 to \$500 (approved by Borough Council previously)
  - o Brown bag lunch; Will keep Lunchables on hand in case kids forget to bring lunch
  - Field trips: looking into field trips but not sure about bussing; Reading Science Center willing to come to the Pavilion for program

#### Pool rates

- o Increase family from \$325 to \$375
- Additional child from \$25 to \$50
- Babysitter from \$100 to \$150
- Day pass from \$8 to \$10 (residents), from \$15 to \$18 (nonresidents)
- 6-day pass from 45 to 50 (residents)
- o Pool parties: from \$7 to \$9 for residents, from \$10 to \$12 for non-residents
- Non-resident rate for family: suggested \$600
- Hiring letters: all mailed out with previous \$1 increase
  - 13 lifeguards (15-20 lifeguards is preferred)

### Skate Park

- Putting in a mini ramp, concrete, single-use halfpipe, 35' x 35', also serve as a memorial to Gianni Molinari (West Reading resident), fully funded.
- Looking at different areas, both on the Reading side of the creek, will not interfere with disc golf course.
- Skate parks often bring good, positive things to community
- Working with Reading Skate Park Association and JD Turner of Holistic Skate (in West Reading)
- Maintenance: basic, general maintenance of concrete; exploring set up a fund for maintenance and agreement to remove graffiti.
- Will also be insurance costs
- Intended to serve as a memorial, including a mural
- Next step: designer draw up plans

Discussed the plans and the committee expressed support for current plans as they move forward.

# Ordinance to change attendance expectation/removal from commission

- Certain rules in the ordinance that must followed by the state, likely need to maintain rules as is (would not be cost effective to pay the solicitor to find that rules cannot be changed)
- Cannot use other borough committee rules as a model
