Public Comment

Bethany Bower interested in joining West Recreation Commission.

Motion to accept the minutes from the March minutes made by Jennifer Sundermier. Seconded by Roger Hinsey. Motion passed unanimously (7-0).

Monisha Knight, owner of West Reading Hot Yoga proposed a 10-week series of moving meditation at the West Reading Park. This will take place Fridays, June 3^{rd} through August 12^{th} from 7:30 am – 8:45 am. It will be a donation based program with anticipated attendance between 8 – 10 people but able to include up to 25 attendees.

Motion to approve to use playground facilities without charging a fee made by Roger Hinsey; seconded by Lori Hoffman – Motion passes unanimously (7-0)

- Tickets are \$10 per person from 6:30 9:00

- Raffle items from various local establishments

Pool and Playground Program

- Applications are still going out. 2 more applications have come in.
- 8 returning guards, 1 concession stand workers and 2 playground leaders coming back
 - Waiting on three guards to get back to us
 - Need concession stand manager, front desk posting on Indeed and social media
 - Would like at least 15 lifeguards to start the season

Lifeguard class at the pool – May 21st and May 22nd from 9 am to 5 pm

- Working on different fee rate for playground
 - Half day (resident rate): from \$175 to \$200 (\$5 per day)
 - Full day (resident rate): increase from \$350 to \$400 (\$8.75 per day)

- Non-resident rate increased from \$400 to \$500 (approved by Borough Council previously)
- Brown bag lunch; Will keep Lunchables on hand in case kids forget to bring lunch
- Field trips: looking into field trips but not sure about bussing; Reading Science Center willing to come to the Pavilion for program
- Pool rates
 - Increase family from \$325 to \$375
 - Additional child from \$25 to \$50
 - Babysitter from \$100 to \$150
 - Day pass from \$8 to \$10 (residents), from \$15 to \$18 (nonresidents)
 - o 6-day pass from 45 to 50 (residents)
 - Pool parties: from \$7 to \$9 for residents, from \$10 to \$12 for non-residents
 - Non-resident rate for family: suggested \$600

<u>Skate Park</u>

- Putting in a mini ramp, concrete, single-use halfpipe, 35' x 35', also serve as a memorial to Gianni Molinari (West Reading resident), fully funded.
- Looking at 2 specific locations, one by the pool (in West Reading Borough) or by the basketball courts (in Reading)
- Skate parks often bring good, positive things to community; Bring more patronage to pool and concession stand
- Working with Reading Skate Park Association and JD Turner of Holistic Skate (in West Reading)
- Intended to serve as a memorial, including a mural

Discussed the plans and the committee expressed support for current plans as they move forward. 5th pocket has been contacted to design a professional rendering.

Motion to approve pocket skate park to be at near the basketball court made by Jennifer Sundermier, second by Kristin Hawley

Ideas for New Events

Rafael Torres has come up with some ideas for new events for the Borough.

- 1. Community Bike Ride
 - a. Happening once a month
 - b. Free

 - d. All age groups welcome
 - e. Possibly on a Friday afternoon or Saturday morning. Avoiding second Friday.

East Ridge had done this previously and worked out well. Berks Area Mountain Bike Association might be helpful. Rafael Torres will come up with a date to share next meeting.

It works through the Movatic app. Two stations are already in Wyomissing and one station is in Wyomissing Park. Ryan Lineaweaver suggested more advertisement for the Family Fun Night. He also suggested a member of the Recreation Commission be in charge of social media. Rafael Torres is now the head of internet promotions.
